CDSBC Standards & Guidelines

The College has recently published two standards and guidelines: Obstructive Sleep Apnea and Minimal and Moderate Sedation Services in Dentistry.

The Obstructive Sleep Apnea Guidelines clarify the role and responsibilities of dentists in the management of OA therapy in patients who are being treated for snoring and/or obstructive sleep apnea.

The <u>Minimal and Moderate Sedation Standards</u> must be read by all registrants who provide minimal or moderate sedation to their patients. Most of the requirements take effect immediately, while others will be phased in. You can read a summary of the requirements at <u>www.cdsbc.org/sedation</u>.
